To be ridden by riders who have attained their 16th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

Riders may only ride a maximum of two horses in each class. Failure to adhere to this rule will result in all scores for this rider, in this class being considered null & void.


Aim

To demonstrate the ability, temperament and suitability of the Irish Draught horse for the amateur riding market. The Irish Draught is the foundation of the Irish sport horse. It should have good movement, rideability, bravery and be capable of participating competently in all equestrian activities. It should be strong, intelligent, willing, sensible and have a kind disposition. A performance element has been included in these classes to demonstrate and showcase the performance potential of the Irish Draught.

Dress & Tack

- Correctly secured protective headgear conforming to the current safety standards must be worn and properly secured at all times.
- The wearing of a body protector is recommended.
- Horses can be shown in any bridle with a bit. The judge will take into consideration the
 effectiveness and severity of the bit and bridle.
- Martingales are not permitted.
- Neckstraps and/or breastplates are permitted.
- No saddle cloths, only saddle contoured numnahs are permitted.
- Only blunt metal spurs or ones with rubber rowels < 2.5cms facing downwards are permitted.
- Front boots of a plain colour may be worn during the flatwork and jumping phase.
- No hind boots or bandages permitted.

The same tack must be used in each phase. No tack etc. may be worn that conceals the conformation of the horse.

Jumping Phase

4 and 5 Year olds-< 85cm in height 6 Year old and over -< 1m in height

Exhibits will be required to jump a course of 9 fences including a double, with natural and derby style fences. Exhibitors are encouraged to show extended canter / gallop at the end of their jumping round. Exhibitors are advised to ensure that their entry is presented by a competent rider.

The rhythm and fluency along with jumping technique and the balance and harmony of the rider will be taken into consideration when judging the jumping phase.

Penalties:

- · For each fence down 4 penalties
- 1st refusal 5 penalties
- 2nd refusal 10 penalties
- 3rd refusal on course Elimination
- Fall of horse or rider Flimination

Conformation Assessment

Once the competitor has completed the jumping phase, he/she will proceed to strip the horse and present in-hand to the conformation judge.

Horses must be 153cms or over.

Competition Format

On entering the arena, each competitor will present to the judge where conformation will be assessed whilst mounted before riding away to demonstrate their horses walk and trot paces on the flat.

Competitors will then proceed straight to the jumping phase which will comprise of a course of show

Competitors will then proceed straight to the jumping phase which will comprise of a course of show jumps immediately followed by natural cross country type fences.

There will be no more than 16 jumping efforts in total with the maximum height of fences being 1m for 5 year olds and 1.10m for the 6&7 year old class.

At the end of the jumping phase, the competitor will demonstrate the ability of their horse to gallop.

The judge will assess each horses performance and marks will be awarded based on conformation & type, paces, way of going throughout the jumping phase and star potential.

In the event of equality of marks, the potential & star quality mark will take precedence.

Judges' marks out of 100 to be awarded as follows:

- Conformation & Type 10 marks
- Paces Walk & Trot 10 marks
- Jumping Scope & Technique 30 marks
- Way of Going 20 marks
- Gallop 10 marks

Rules

- Eventing colours and attire must be worn along with the required dress code of beige, fawn or cream breeches, long black/brown boots and gloves.
- Any suitable snaffle bridle may be worn. Bits must be used in their manufactured condition without any addition or modification to, or on, any part and conform to the requirements of the class. The bit must never be used to reprimand the horse. Judges will take into consideration the effectiveness and severity of the bit and bridle and their decision is final.
- Martingales, neckstraps and/or breastplates are permitted.
- Standing martingales are not permitted.
- Numnahs (if used) must conform neatly with saddle contours. Saddle cloths or visible logos are not permitted.
- Hind leg boots or bandages are not allowed. Overreach boots are permitted.
- Only blunt metal spurs, or ones with rubber rowels <2.5cms facing downwards are permitted.
- No item of tack excluded from competition is allowed in the practice arena.
- If for any reason a competitor goes through the start with incorrect tack, the judge will have no option but to eliminate that competitor.

CLIFDEN QUALIFIER

The Clifden High Performance final will be held in the Showgrounds, Clifden, Co. Galway on Friday 22nd August 2025 featuring a prize fund of €3000. The Connemara Pony Festival Clifden run this class with the aim of displaying the versatility of the Connemara pony, highlighting the performance aspect of the pony over fences with emphasis on the rideability, scope, versatility and suitability for child or adult.

The final will take place on day four of the Annual Connemara Pony Show in Clifden, Co. Galway on Friday 22nd August 2025. There will be 6 shows holding qualifiers nationally for the final. The entry fee for the Balmoral qualifier is £25 per pony (enter for qualifiers with the show holding the qualifier) Entry fee for the final €40per pony. The top four ponies will qualify from each qualifier. The qualifiers and the final will be primarily run under the Irish Pony Society Rules for the working hunters so the scoring system will be the same.

At the qualifiers ponies will be asked to jump a minimum of 9 numbered fences including a double and a triple combination at a minimum height of 1m high and 1m wide, a minimum of three fences at the qualifiers should be built to a height of 110cm high and 110cm wide. Each fence will be marked out of 10 and then a mark out of 20 will be awarded for the way of going. The total is then divided by 2 and penalties are then deducted. A knock -10, 1st refusal -15, 2nd refusal - 20, 3rd refusal - elimination. A fall of rider will incur elimination.

This will complete phase one.

In phase 2, each pony will be asked to show, trot, canter and gallop. Unless otherwise requested ponies will be required to show canter on both reins with a simple change of canter lead through trot. The pony will be stripped and judged for movement, conformation true to breed and type true to breed (i.e. Connemara). The total marks for phase 2 will be 45 consisting of manners (10), performance (10), movement (10), breed conformation (10), and type (5).

At the final ponies will be asked to jump a course of a minimum of 12 numbered fences which will include a double and a treble up to a maximum height of 110cm and width of 110cm (minimum height being 1m and a width of 1m). A joker fence will also be included, which will carry double marks but will be at a maximum height (110cm) and will pose a certain level of difficulty over and above the other fences on the course. Weather permitting, the river may be used with an optional fence been provided. This will complete phase one.

High Performance is expected.

Rules for Qualifiers and Final

- 1. Open to Connemara Ponies in possession of a CPBS passport, aged 5yrs old and over. Passports and microchips will be checked prior to the class.
- 2. Stallions must be ridden by a rider that has attained their 14th birthday before the 1st of January of the current year.
- 3. Bitless bridles and gags are not allowed. Pelhams must have two reins leading from hands to the bit or a single with leather roundings. Three ring snaffles must have two reins or a set of roundings.
- 4. Only front boots are permitted for phase 1, boots must removed for phase 2.
- 5. Spurs are not allowed.
- 6. Passports of qualifying ponies may be checked at the qualifier and must be presented at the final. Microchips will be checked at the final.
- 7. Running martingales only.
- 8. Riders who have not attained their 16th birthday before the 1st of January 2025 must wear a body protector for phase 1. Body protectors must be removed for phase 2.
- 9. A rider may compete no more than two ponies at any one qualifier, but only one rider/pony combination may be chosen to compete at the final- this choice must be declared at the relevant qualifier.

It is recommended that if you intend to compete at the High Performance Final that you attend as many qualifiers as possible in preparation- ponies already qualified will compete in other qualifiers Hors Concours (HC).

REGULATIONS SPECIFIC TO EQUINE EXHIBITORS

Also see General Rules and Regulations for exhibitors on our website.

Procedures for movement of equine animals are listed in the Show Guidance for exhibitors. A copy can be downloaded from the DAERA website.

E1. CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Equines may only be entered in one section, either horse or pony.

The owners details of horses and ponies entered must be submitted on the entry form and these details should match the ownership on the passport.

The ages of all horses competing to be calculated from 1st January. Yearlings must provide date of birth on entry form.

Passport numbers must be supplied with the entry, otherwise entry will be null and void.

Passports must accompany all horses and be available for inspection. Horses without passports <u>will</u> <u>not</u> be permitted into the showgrounds.

E2. ELIGIBILITY OF RIDERS

In order to establish that riders of horses and ponies are of the correct age for the class entered, it will be the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that the passport or birth certificate of the rider is available for inspection by the stewards if requested. Riders to be correct age for the height of the pony.

Ponies are only allowed to be ridden on the Show Grounds by riders of the appropriate age, in accordance with the class specification for which it is entered.

E3. NUMBERS

Back numbers, corresponding with the catalogue number of the animal will be provided, and **must be worn by the grooms or riders**, at all times, or in the case of harness horses, on the back of the carriages. Bridle numbers are also provided, and these must be worn when the exhibits are out of the stables. If these numbers are not clearly displayed, you will not be allowed to enter the warm up area.

E4. DRESS

Each rider and groom must be correctly dressed, and protective headgear conforming to the current safety standards should be worn at all times whilst mounted.

All exhibitors are encouraged to wear recommended protective headgear to BSI standard with chin strap but in the working hunter horse classes and in the ridden and working hunter children's pony classes, exhibitors <u>must</u> wear a riding hat complying with the current safety standards at all times whilst mounted. All exhibitors under 18 years in the Private Driving and Light Trade section should wear protective headgear complying with the current safety standards.

All riders should be correctly dressed when walking the course (no denims should be worn).

No earrings, piercings, or visible jewellery should be worn.

E5: HEALTH DECLARATION & VACCINATIONS

Each animal will be examined on arrival at the Showgrounds, by a veterinary surgeon appointed by the Society, before being permitted to occupy its loose box or at any other time during the Show.

Compulsory Vaccination against Equine Influenza – All equine animals wishing to compete at Balmoral Show must be vaccinated against equine influenza – no equine will be admitted to the show ground unless they have the following;

Compulsory Vaccination against Equine Influenza - All equine animals wishing to compete at Balmoral Show must be vaccinated against equine influenza - no equine will be admitted to the show ground unless they have the following;

- A minimum of the Primary course consisting of 2 vaccinations, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart (not within 7 days of the show).
- A booster must then be given 150 215 days after the 2nd primary vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).
- An annual booster must be given within 12 months of the previous vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).

All vaccinations must be properly documented in the animal's passport and signed by a veterinary surgeon and stamped with their official practice stamp to authenticate each vaccination.

Please note: Foals should be vaccinated from 5 months.

If there is a current outbreak of Equine Influenza in Ireland, G.B. USA and other European countries – please ensure that all Persons Responsible (Owners/Athletes) keep up to date with FEI, HSI and SJI requirements regarding vaccinations, and biosecurity best hygiene practices, as they may have to be amended should further outbreaks continue. Updates will be found on the appropriate websites. All passports must be up to date, or entry to the Showgrounds will not be allowed.

Control: The influenza virus is easily destroyed outside the body. Cleanliness is required to control it. The greatest risk spread appears to be by nasal discharge and by attendant's hands. Horses may harbor the virus for approx. nine to ten days after coughing ceases.

The virus will survive in wet, humid conditions in horse boxes, stables etc but in dry or warm dry conditions it soon dies.

E6: RANDOM DOPE TESTING

Equines entered at Balmoral Show maybe subject to sampling for illegal substance

Tests will be carried out by the Society's appointed veterinary surgeon and a steward will accompany the veterinary surgeon when tests are being taken.

Should the sample taken prove positive, on analysis, for a prohibited substance, the exhibit will be disqualified.

E7: GROOMS

If any groom is absent from his horse at the time of judging, the horse will be liable to be excluded from competition. Grooms in charge of horses remaining in the Showground overnight must be in attendance at 7am each morning to clean out the stables.

E8: STABLING

A stable is no longer included with your entry and must be booked when completing your entries.

NB: Exhibitors are not permitted to work from their horse boxes/lorries and must book a stable for the required night(s), with the exception of, Clydesdales/Agri Horses, Driving & Hackney Classes and Donkeys.

Stables will include some shavings which have kindly provided by Bluefrog. A limited supply of shavings will be available to purchase from the stable manager.

Equestrian Farms feeds can deliver additional bedding if ordered in advance. It is advisable to use rubber mats in stables due to ground conditions.

No horse may be stabled in a stable other than that allocated to it by Society officials.

Any Horse in isolation will not be allowed out of the isolation box, except by order of one of the stewards or a senior member of staff.

E9: EXERCISING

Ridden horses and led horses will be allowed to exercise in the warmup areas. Exercising in the judging rings or main arena is strictly prohibited.

All arenas and the lunging pen will be closed between **10.30pm & 5am (Tuesday – Saturday)**. All equines must be stabled during these times except in the case of an emergency. Any exhibitor seen violating this rule will have all entries cancelled and/or any prizes/placings already gained made null and void. (Also see rule 44 of the General Rules and Regulations)

Lunging in the Horse Rings practice arena is only permitted on: Tuesday 13th May from 9am – 10.30pm and Wednesday 15th May from 5.am – 12noon. Those wishing to lunge outside of these times must use the lunge pen.

The exercising or examination of horses on the paths or roadways is strictly forbidden.

E10: PARADES

A parade of prizewinning young stock horses will take place in P&O Arena on Wednesday 14 May. The Champion, Reserve Champion and 1^{st} – 3rd prize winners in each class will be required to participate.

A parade of prizewinning horses will take place in the Main Arena on Thursday 15 May. The Champions, Reserve Champions and $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ prize winners in the following classes are required to participate; Ridden Hunter, Coloured Horses, Ladies Hunters Astride, Ladies Side Saddle - Balmoral Classic Competition, Riding Horses, Ridden Irish Draught, Performance Irish Draught and Ridden Connemara Ponies.

A parade of prizewinning Heavy horses will take place on Friday 16 May in the P&O Arena. The Champion, reserve champion and $1^{st} - 3^{rd}$ prize winners in each class are required to participate.

Exhibitors will be advised of the collection arrangements for parades at the time of the presentation of class prizes.

If an animal is absent from a parade without good reason, the exhibitor is liable to forfeit the prize or prizes won by the animal.

E11: MEASUREMENTS AND DECLARATIONS OF HORSES

Horses and ponies entered in classes with a height restriction must be in possession of a current height or final measurement certificate appropriate to their class. This certificate should be issued by a society or scheme approved by the FEI or issued by a National Federation affiliated to the FEI or a certificate issued by a society or scheme approved by such National Federation, and must be presented with their passport at arrivals.

E12: TACK

Exhibitors of ridden ponies are permitted to use double bridles. For other specific tack information please see the appropriate class rules.

E13: SHOEING

For horses and ponies that are shod, only normal shoes that do not cover the frog are permissible. Normal shaped open heeled plastic stick-on shoes are permissible. No bar shoes, pads or gel pads are allowed.

E14: FALL OF RIDER

In the case of a fall of a rider at any time in the competition or practice arenas, the rider must be checked by the paramedic service, prior to any further participation in competition or schooling.

E15: UNACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOUR

Forms of cruel, inhumane, or abusive treatment of horses or ponies, including, but not limited to, the various forms of rapping, are strictly forbidden in all areas of the Showgrounds.

E16: REFUNDS

50% of entry fees will be refunded for all equine classes if cancelled before **Wednesday 26 March 2025**. Withdrawals and refunds are made through the exhibitor's online account and any refund due till be available to claim after the show.
