

- a. Athletes may not qualify more than two horses in each of the National competitions except the Amateur class where they may only qualify one horse. When an athlete has reached their quota, no further horses may be qualified.
- b. Qualifying places will go down the line if those placed above are already qualified. Where this is exhausted the next eligible combination will be taken from the highest placed, not already qualified combination from the 1st qualifier, and where this is exhausted to the 2nd qualifier and so on.
- In order to secure a qualifying place for the championship the combination must have completed the c. course
- d. Should a horse/athlete be unable to take their place at the final, their place will be filled by the horse/athlete combination next in line from that particular gualifying venue, providing that their 1st round has been completed. If this is exhausted then 'b.' above will apply.
- e. At presentation passports must be produced and microchips will be read for all gualified animals.

ENTRY FEE

£57 per entry (non-refundable). Once qualified entries must be made online within 48 hours of qualifying at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/national-show-jumping.

PARKING

Parking in the Red Show Jumping car park for National competitors is **NOT** included in the entry fee and should be booked for the day of the competition when making entries or purchased online at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/national-show-jumping up to Friday 25 April 2025. Anything ordered after this date will have an additional £3.50 surcharge added. Parking Fee: Lorry £35, Car & Trailer/Horsebox £30, Car £20 per day. (Please refer to Car Park Map for reference).

STABLING

Overnight stables are strictly limited and must be booked and paid for in advance along with entry fees. They will be charged at £35 per night. Some shavings will be supplied for bedding. Bluefrog are the sole suppliers of stable bedding for Balmoral Show. Additional shavings if required will be available for sale onsite. Stable bookings must be made online before Friday 25 April 2025 at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-iumping/national-show-iumping.

WRISTBANDS

Wristbands per qualified athlete will be issued for the applicable day as follows: 1 athlete (covers multiple rides), 1 owner, 1 groom per horse.

Additional wristbands costing £15 each per day (up to a maximum of 10) or £55 for 4 days can be purchased online no later than **Friday 25 April 2025**_at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/national-show-jumping. Any wristbands ordered after this date will have an additional £3.50 surcharge added.

ARRIVALS

For those competing on Wednesday in SJ1, SJ2 and SJ3 all animals must arrive between **6am & 8am** on the day of competition. If you wish to arrive the day before (Tuesday) and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive anytime between **9am & 9pm.**

If competing in SJ10 Amateurs on Saturday all animals must be on the showgrounds **between 6am & 8am.** If you wish to arrive the night before (Friday) and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive between **6pm & 9pm.**

Any animal not on site as above may be deemed a non-starter and may be excluded from the competition.

All animals will be subject to 'arrival' inspections, where animals will need to be unloaded to facilitate passport/microchip checks. Please allow sufficient time for this to take place.

SUBSTITUTIONS

Entries must be the same combination as qualified i.e. horse and athlete. It will only be in the following circumstances that the athlete who qualified the animal will not compete that animal at the Balmoral Show:

a. A bona fide sale and change of registered owner

- b. A proven athlete injury confirmed by medical certificate
- c. Other exceptional circumstances

In all cases a change may only be allowed on written request, with the approval of the RUAS Show Director and the Show Jumping Committee Chairperson. All changes in ownership, regardless of athlete change, must be done through the SJI office before **Wednesday 8 May 2025**.

If at any time between the qualifying date and **Friday 25 April 2025** the horse/athlete combination who qualified is unable to jump at Balmoral Show they must notify Vickie White, RUAS immediately to enable the next placed horse/athlete combination at the relevant qualifying venue to be invited to enter.

DEDUCTION FROM WINNINGS

5% of all prize money won in competitions SJ1, SJ2 and 10% in SJ3 will be deducted at the end of the show for crediting to the Show Jumping Ireland Sport Development Fund. Prize Money will be issued after Balmoral Show to the address as per the entry.

HIND BOOTS

Article 257.2.4N. It is important that all owners/athletes are aware of the rules pertaining to the wearing of hind boots in young horse classes. Please refer to the above article number in the current SJI Rule Book and any later amendments on the SJI website. Stewards will be on hand to ensure this rule is adhered to.







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128 - 85cm UNDER 10's CHAMPIONSHIP

The Under 10's Championship is restricted to those who have pre-qualified.

SJ12 5 pony/athlete combinations will qualify at each qualifying venue.

- Qualifiers and final will be run under Article 238 2.2 (only if time is an issue may a gualifier be run a. under Article 274 5.3). The Championship will be run under SJI rules and regulations.
- b. Qualifying places will go down the line if those placed above are already qualified. Where this is exhausted the next eligible combination will be taken from the highest placed, not already qualified combination from the 1^{st} qualifier, and where this is exhausted to the 2^{nd} qualifier and so on.
- c. In order to secure a qualifying place for the championship the combination must have completed the course.
- d. Should an athlete qualify more than the quota for a category, where the athlete first qualifies in the highest place in the competition on a particular day will determine the qualifying place.
- e. It is the qualified pony/athlete combination who are eligible to compete at the final, no substitutions are permitted.
- f. Should a pony/athlete be unable to take their place at the final, their place will be filled by the pony/athlete combination next in line from that particular qualifying venue, providing that their 1st round has been completed. If this is exhausted then 'b.' above will apply.

ENTRY FEE

£57 per entry (non-refundable). Once qualified entries must be made online within 48 hours of qualifying at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/under-10s.

PARKING

Parking in the Red Show Jumping car park for National Competitors is NOT included in the entry fee and should be booked for the day of the competition when making entries or purchased online at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/under-10s up to Friday 25 April 2025. Anything ordered after this date will have an additional £3.50 surcharge added. Parking Fee: Lorry £35, Car & Trailer/Horsebox £30, Car £20 per day. (Please refer to Car Park Map for reference).

STABLING

Overnight stables are limited and must be booked and paid for in advance along with entry fees. They will be charged at £35 per night. Some shavings will be supplied for bedding. Bluefrog are the sole suppliers of stable bedding for Balmoral Show. Additional shavings if required will be available for sale onsite. Stable bookings must be made online before Friday 25 April 2025 at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/under-10s.

WRISTBANDS

4 wristbands per qualified athlete will be issued for the applicable day. Additional wristbands costing £15 each per day (up to a maximum of 10) or £55 for 4 days can be purchased online no later than Friday 25 April 2025 at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/under-10s. Any wristbands ordered after this date will have an additional £3.50 surcharge added.

ARRIVALS & DECLARATIONS

For those competing in SJ12 all animals must be on the showgrounds **between 6am & 8am** on the day of competition. If you wish to arrive the night before and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive between **6pm & 9pm.** Any animal not on site as above may be deemed a non-starter and may be excluded from the competition.

All animals will be subject to 'arrival' inspections, where animals will need to be unloaded to facilitate passport/microchip checks. Please allow sufficient time for this to take place.

PRIZE FUND

£1,000 prize money. 5% of all prize money won in SJ10 will be deducted at the end of the show for crediting to the Show Jumping Ireland Sport Development Fund. Prize Money will be issued after Balmoral Show to the address as per the entry.

NATIONAL REGULATIONS

All National competitions will be governed by the current National Federation and Show Jumping Ireland rules and regulations.

National competitions are restricted to pre-qualified horses/ponies and athletes registered with SJI and to Irish athletes or those with specific authority from the SJI to compete in National competitions. As arena time is at a premium, numbers of entries are restricted as listed above. Therefore, those qualifying 2 horses/ponies in a class will be required to have both warmed up and ready to compete prior to the start of the event.

VETERINARY CONTROLS

All equine animals wishing to compete at Balmoral Show must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. Passports with certification confirming proper vaccination must be available for inspection on arrival and at any time during the Balmoral Show. No equine will be admitted to the showgrounds unless they have the following:

- A minimum of the Primary course consisting of 2 vaccinations, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart (not within 7 days of the show).
- A booster should then be given 150 215 days after the 2nd primary vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).
- An annual booster should be given within 12 months of the previous vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).


All vaccinations should be properly documented in the animal's passport and signed by a veterinary surgeon and stamped with their official practice stamp to authenticate each vaccination.

It is the owner's responsibility to ensure the above has been administered and all dates are correct. Failure to do so will result in the animal not being admitted to the showgrounds.

The above regulations are correct at the time of going to print, but may, because of exceptional circumstances, be amended from time to time. It is important to keep up to date with the SJI website to ensure passports are correct.

Horses entered in National classes may be subject to sampling for illegal substances by HSI.

Horses selected for any of the International competitions will <u>not</u> be eligible to compete in any of the National competitions at the Show.



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SCHOOLS OPEN TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

The Schools Open Team Championship is restricted to those schools who have pre-gualified. 5 teams from Ulster Region (includes Cavan, Monaghan & Donegal) and 5 teams from the rest of the Republic of Ireland.

SJ11 The winning school team in the Open Class will qualify at each qualifying venue in Ulster region. The top 5 schools from the Equestrian Interschools Ireland League will qualify from Republic of Ireland.

- A gualifying school team must consist of a minimum of 3 athletes and a maximum of 4, all currently a. in full time 2nd level education at the same school they represent.
- b. No athlete/animal may compete more than once in the same team.
- c. Once a school has gualified, they are unable to take a further gualifying place. Qualifying places will go down the line if the team placed above is already qualified.
- d. The Championship and at all participating qualifying venues will run under SJI rules as a Competition in Two Phases - Article 274.5.3. Maximum height of fences will be 1m.

ENTRY FEE

For all gualified schools the team entry fee of £200 must be paid online at

www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/schools-team-show-jumping by Wednesday 9 April 2025 along with the definite entries (team participants - athletes/animals) and intended running order. The name and contact details of the team Chef d'Equipe must be identified with the entry.

PARKING/WRISTBANDS

Team entry fee includes parking passes in the Red Show Jumping car park for 4 horse lorries/trailers and 1 car along with 10 wristbands (1 for each athlete, 1 for a parent/guardian of each athlete, and 2 for school representatives).

Additional wristbands or parking can be purchased online no later than Friday 25 April 2025 at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/schools-team-show-jumping. Any wristbands or parking ordered after this date will have an additional £3.50 surcharge added. (Please refer to Car Park Map for reference).

STABLING

Stables are limited and should be booked and paid for in advance online along with entry fees. They will be charged at £35 per night. Limited shavings are provided. Additional shavings are available to purchase on site.

ARRIVALS

Teams may arrive on Friday night (providing a stable has been pre-purchased) from 6pm – 9pm or on Saturday morning from 6am - 8am only. Entry to Balmoral Park may be refused outside of these arrival times. It is not necessary for all team members to arrive together.



VETERINARY CONTROLS

All equine animals wishing to compete at Balmoral Show must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. Passports with certification confirming proper vaccination must be available for inspection on arrival and at any time during the Balmoral Show. No equine will be admitted to the showgrounds unless they have the following:

- A minimum of the Primary course consisting of 2 vaccinations, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart (not within 7 days of the show).
- A booster should then be given 150 215 days after the 2nd primary vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).
- An annual booster should be given within 12 months of the previous vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).

All vaccinations should be properly documented in the animal's passport and signed by a veterinary surgeon and stamped with their official practice stamp to authenticate each vaccination. It is the owner's responsibility to ensure the above has been administered and all dates are correct. Failure to do so will result in the animal not being admitted to the showgrounds.

DECLARATIONS

The Chef d'Equipe should identify themselves at the Declarations Office beside the practice arena **between 8.15am and 8.30am** on the morning of the event to declare all team athletes/animals. A **compulsory** health & safety briefing will immediately follow and must be attended by all Chef d'Equipes. The Chef d'Equipe is the only person eligible to liaise with the Starter/Ground Jury regarding any difficulties during the competition, e.g. an animal losing a shoe etc. Any rider or school representative showing unsporting behaviour will automatically be disqualified from their team, and/or have their team disqualified.

SUBSTITUTIONS

No substitutions from the definite entries are allowed, except in the case of a proven injury where the substitution of an athlete/animal from the definite entry list may be allowed **up to 4.00pm on Friday 9 May 2025.** After this date/time, no substitution will be considered. In this regard, the Organising Committee/Showjumping Sub-Committee's decision is final.

ORDER OF STARTING

The order of Teams starting at the Championship will be drawn by the Organising Committee on the day following close of entries. Schools are required to make their definite entries in the order they wish their athletes to compete. Start lists for the Championship will be available online at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/schools-team-show-jumping.

PRIZE GIVING

At all qualifying competitions in Ulster Region, the team qualifying on the day will receive qualified rosettes. All 5 ROI teams will receive a qualified rosette when the Chef d'Equipe presents to the Declarations Office.

At the Championship 1st – 3rd teams will be awarded prizes in kind.

The Bluegrass Horse Feed Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winning school.

The winning school will be invited by the sponsor to visit their premises to have an educational guided tour.

Rosettes will be awarded to all competing teams. The top 3 teams will be invited to the main arena for the prize giving ceremony. The Chef d'Equipe of the remaining teams will receive their rosettes from the Declarations Office.

A Team Turnout prize will be awarded at the Championship to the most appropriately turned out team as chosen by the sponsor. This team will be invited into the main arena to receive their rosettes if they are not already in the top 3 teams.





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GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

- 1. ARENA Balmoral Show is an outdoor event and the arena dimensions are 170m long and 80m wide with a grass surface. The practice area is 40m x 65m and has a sand/fibre surface.
- 2. DRESS Exhibitors must ensure that the athletes of their animals are correctly attired and that protective headgear is worn at all times when exhibits are being ridden. It is compulsory for all persons to wear properly fastened protective headgear with a three point retention harness at all times when mounted. Art. 256.1.4.
- 3. FALLS In case of a fall of an athlete and/or a horse at any time in the competition arena, in the practice arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the event's medical service (or by a medical doctor if the medical service is not available) before they may be permitted to take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event, respectively the horse must be cleared by the Veterinary Delegate before it may be permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event, according to provisions in paragraphs 4.1. to 4.3. under JRs Art. 224.4. Athletes are expected to make themselves aware of the detail of the FEI & SJI Jumping Regulations.
- 4. Should any animal be absent from the position allotted by the stewards in the assembly pocket or should the athlete fail to be in attendance or ready to take his/her allotted part in each round, the animal may be **EXCLUDED** from the competition.
- 5. All forms of cruel, inhumane or abusive treatment of horses, including, but not limited to, the various forms of rapping, are strictly forbidden in all exercise, schooling and competitions areas as well as elsewhere within the showgrounds.
- 6. Any animal not sufficiently under control will not be allowed to compete.
- 7. ENTRY TO JUMPING POCKET The exhibitor of an animal entered for jumping shall be admitted, if wearing the correct wristband, to the competitor's paddock and assembly pocket on the day or days on which the animal is due to compete.
- 8. **INSPECTION OF COURSE** The arena will be declared open following inspection by the Ground Jury and Course Designer. The course will be open for inspection 15 minutes before the start of the competition and will be walked on foot.

When inspecting the course, correct dress must be worn. All coaches/support staff/grooms should be tidily dressed when walking the course.

Stewards may refuse admission to the arena if not correctly dressed when entering the arena to walk the course.

9. **DOGS** - No dogs other than assistance dogs are permitted in the showgrounds.

10. INSURANCE

Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the event organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or horses at or in connection with a FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

Personal Accident, Health Insurance & Personal Property

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at the Balmoral Show and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at the Event. You should ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at the Event.

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Third Party Liability Insurance

As an athlete/owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses. You are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to events at home and abroad and to keep your policy up to date. The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses.

ADDITIONAL AWARDS - National & International

Winning Owner Award

A suitable memento will be awarded to the owner of the winning horse in each National and International competition.

Leading International Athlete Award

Non-cash awards will be presented by Equestrian & Farm Feeds to the athlete who has gained most points in all International competitions.

Points will be awarded for each competition as follows: - 1st 8; 2nd 6; 3rd 5; 4th 3; 5th 2; 6th 1. Where prizes are divided, each athlete dividing will gain the points appropriate to the major prize. In the event of equality for first place, the placing in SJ9 will decide. In the event of further equality, the greatest number of first prizes or second prizes etc. will decide.

Leading International Speed Athlete Award

Causeway Coast Show Jumpers have kindly offered to present a tankard to the athlete gaining most points in SJ4, SJ6 and SJ8. Points will be awarded for each competition as above and in the event of equality for first place the greatest number of first or second prizes etc. in these competitions will decide.

International Grooms Awards

A suitable memento, presented by Rydale, will be awarded to the groom of the winning horse in each International competition (SJ4 - SJ9).

International SJ7

One ton of feed, kindly provided by Connolly's RED MILLS will be awarded and delivered to the winner rider of SJ7 The Connolly's RED MILLS International Spectacular.

The Grooms Group Awards

Prizes will be awarded by the The Grooms Group, to the highest place member of The Grooms Group in SJ1 – SJ3 and SJ9

Best Young Rider Awards

Prizes will be awarded by Equestrian & Farm Feeds to the top 3 Young Rider athletes placed in SJ3.


