1. Portmore Equestrian Centre Saturday 7 & Sunday 8 March

- a. An athlete may only qualify **one** horse for any championship class at the Balmoral Show.
- b. A horse cannot start in more than one qualifier category for the Balmoral Show. It is the responsibility of the owner/athlete to ensure that all horses and athletes are eligible to compete in the relevant qualifying competition and to make sure the correct horse/athlete combination has qualified.
- c. Qualifying places will go down the line if those placed above are already qualified. Where this is exhausted the next eligible combination will be taken from the highest placed, not already qualified combination from the 1st qualifier, and where this is exhausted to the 2nd qualifier and so on.
- d. The horse/athlete must have completed the course to be eligible for a qualifying place.
- e. A horse's first qualification will secure its qualification, regardless of further placings at later qualifiers.
- f. Should an athlete qualify more than the quota for a category, where the athlete first qualifies in the highest place in the competition on a particular day will determine the qualifying place.
- g. If the owner/athlete has not entered the horse by the closing date of entries for the Balmoral Show; the **14 April**, it will automatically be assumed that the owner/athlete does not wish to take up the qualifying place, and the next eligible horse in line from the applicable qualifier will be contacted on or before the 17 April.
- h. Should a horse/athlete be unable to take their place at the final, their place will be filled by the horse/athlete combination next in line from that particular qualifying venue, providing that their 1st round has been completed. If this is exhausted then 'c.' above will apply.
- i. All animals that qualify for Balmoral Show may be scanned for microchips at the qualifiers to verify identity, passports must also be available for inspection.
- j. All qualifying competitions should be judges under Article 238.2.2, however, and only if time is an issue, a qualifier may be run as a Competition in Two Phases, Article 274.5.3. Special Two Phase rules must NOT be used.

ENTRY FEE

£60 per entry. Once qualified, entries (non-refundable) must be made online via the Balmoral Show website www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/national-show-jumping.

Please note that the Balmoral Show closing date of the **14 April 2026** for show jumping entries will be strictly adhered to, and late entries will not be accepted.

PARKING

Parking for National competitors in the **Blue** vehicle park is NOT included in the entry fee and should be booked for the day of the competition. Space is limited therefore it is recommended to purchase online via your E-Net account when making entries.



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Cost for Car & Trailer/Duo Horsebox parking will be £35 per vehicle. Lorries will be charged at £40.

If overnight stabling has been purchased, parking passes will allow access to the vehicle park from 6pm the evening before. Additional parking for cars can be purchased for the Brown vehicle park costing £25 per car per day.

STABLING

Overnight stables are strictly limited and should be booked and paid for in advance along with entry fees. They will be charged at £35 per night. Some shavings will be supplied for bedding.

Bluefrog are the sole suppliers of stable bedding for Balmoral Show. Additional shavings if required will be available for sale onsite.

Stable bookings (for the day of the competition) must be made online via your E-Net account before **17 April 2026**.

WRISTBANDS

2 wristbands per qualified entry will be issued for the applicable day and will need to be collected on arrival to permit access to the showgrounds.

Additional wristbands costing £16 each (up to a maximum of 5) can be purchased online via your E-Net account. Wristbands purchased during show days will cost £20.

SUBSTITUTIONS/WITHDRAWALS

Entries must be the same combination as qualified i.e. horse and athlete.

It will only be in the following circumstances that the athlete who qualified the animal will not compete that animal at the Balmoral Show:

- a. A bona fide sale and change of registered owner
- b. A proven athlete injury confirmed by medical certificate
- c. Other exceptional circumstances

In all cases a change may only be allowed on written request, with the approval of the RUAS Show Director and the Show Jumping Committee Chairperson. All changes in ownership, regardless of athlete change, must be done through the SJJ office before **6 May 2026**.

If at any time after the closing date of entries, the horse/athlete combination who qualified is unable to jump at Balmoral Show, they must notify Vickie White, RUAS immediately to enable the next placed horse/athlete combination at the relevant qualifying venue to be invited to enter.

No changes to the qualified combinations will be made after the **17 April 2026**.

ARRIVALS

For those competing on Wednesday in SJ1, SJ2 and SJ3 all animals must arrive **between 6am & 8am** on the day of competition. If you wish to arrive the day before (Tuesday) and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive anytime between **9am & 9pm**.

If competing in SJ10 Amateurs on Saturday all animals must be on the showgrounds **between 6am & 8am**. If you wish to arrive the night before (Friday) and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive between **6pm & 9pm**.

Arrival outside these times will result in refusal of entry. Any animal not on site as above may be deemed a non-starter and may be excluded from the competition.

All animals will be subject to inspection by the RUAS veterinary team. On arrival animals will need to be unloaded and report to the Equine Office/Vetting Area to facilitate checks. Passports with up-to-date vaccinations must be available for inspection. Please allow sufficient time for this to take place.

Any animal without a passport or up-to-date vaccinations will be refused entry.

PRIZE MONEY

5% of all prize money won in competitions SJ1, SJ2 and 10% in SJ3 will be deducted at the end of the show for crediting to the Show Jumping Ireland Sport Development Fund.

Prize Money will be available to be claimed after Balmoral Show and payable only to the account holder from which the entry was made. Any monies not claimed by **31 March 2027** may be forfeited.

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128 - 85cm UNDER 10's CHAMPIONSHIP

The Under 10's Championship is restricted to those who have pre-qualified.

- a. An athlete may only qualify one pony for the championship at the Balmoral Show.
 - b. Qualifying places will go down the line if those placed above are already qualified. Where this is exhausted the next eligible combination will be taken from the highest placed, not already qualified combination from the 1st qualifier, and where this is exhausted to the 2nd qualifier and so on.
 - c. The pony/athlete must have completed the course to be eligible for a qualifying place.
 - d. A pony's first qualification will secure its qualification, regardless of further placings at later qualifiers.
 - e. Should an athlete qualify more than the quota for a category, where the athlete first qualifies in the highest place in the competition on a particular day will determine the qualifying place.
 - f. It is the qualified pony/athlete combination who are eligible to compete at the final, no substitutions are permitted.
 - g. If the owner/athlete has not entered the pony by the closing date of entries for the Balmoral Show; the 14 April, it will automatically be assumed that the owner/athlete does not wish to take up the qualifying place, and the next eligible pony in line from the applicable qualifier will be contacted on or before the 17 April.
 - h. Should a pony/athlete be unable to take their place at the final, their place will be filled by the pony/athlete combination next in line from that particular qualifying venue, providing that their 1st round has been completed. If this is exhausted then 'b.' above will apply.
 - k. All animals that qualify for Balmoral Show may be scanned for microchips at the qualifiers to verify identity, passports must also be available for inspection.
 - l. All qualifying competitions should be judges under Article 238.2.2, however, and only if time is an issue, a qualifier may be run as a Competition in Two Phases, Article 274.5.3. Special Two Phase rules must NOT be used.

ENTRY FEE

£60 per entry. Once qualified, entries (non-refundable) must be made online via the Balmoral Show website www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/under-10s.

Please note that the Balmoral Show closing date of the **14 April 2026** for show jumping entries will be strictly adhered to, and late entries will not be accepted.

PARKING

Parking for National competitors in the **Blue** vehicle park is NOT included in the entry fee and should be booked for the day of the competition. Space is limited, therefore it is recommended to purchase online via your E-Net account when making entries.

Cost for Car & Trailer/Duo Horsebox parking will be £35 per vehicle. Lorries will be charged at £40.

If overnight stabling has been purchased, parking passes will allow access to the vehicle park from 6pm the evening before. Additional parking for cars can be purchased for the Brown vehicle park costing £25 per car per day.



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STABLING

WITHDRAWALS

If at any time after the closing date of entries, the pony/athlete combination who qualified is unable to jump at Balmoral Show, they must notify Vickie White, RUAS immediately to enable the next placed pony/athlete combination at the relevant qualifying venue to be invited to enter.

No changes to the qualified combinations will be made after the 17 April 2026.

ARRIVALS

For those competing in SJ12, all animals must be on the showgrounds **between 6am & 8am** on the day of competition. If you wish to arrive the night before and have pre purchased a stable, please arrive between **6pm & 9pm**.

Arrival outside these times will result in refusal of entry. Any animal not on site as above may be deemed a non-starter and may be excluded from the competition.

All animals will be subject to inspection by the RUAS veterinary team. On arrival animals will need to be unloaded and report to the Equine Office/Vetting Area to facilitate checks. Passports with up-to-date vaccinations and height certificates must be available for inspection. Please allow sufficient time for this to take place. Any animal without a passport or up-to-date vaccinations will be refused entry.

PRIZE MONEY

£1,000 prize money. 5% of all prize money won in SJ10 will be deducted at the end of the show for crediting to the Show Jumping Ireland Sport Development Fund.

Prize Money will be available to be claimed after Balmoral Show and payable only to the account holder from which the entry was made. Any monies not claimed by **31 March 2027** may be forfeited.

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SCHOOLS OPEN TEAM CHAMPIONSHIP

The Schools Open Team Championship is restricted to those schools who have pre-qualified. 5 teams from Ulster Region (includes Cavan, Monaghan & Donegal) and 5 teams from the rest of the Republic of Ireland.

SJ11 The winning school team in the Open Class will qualify at each qualifying venue in Ulster region. The top 5 schools from the Equestrian Interschools Ireland League will qualify from Republic of Ireland.

- a. A qualifying school team must consist of a minimum of 3 athletes and a maximum of 4, all currently in full time 2nd level education at the same school they represent.
 - b. No athlete/animal may compete more than once in the same team.
 - c. Once a school has qualified, they are unable to take a further qualifying place. Qualifying places will go down the line if the team placed above is already qualified.
 - d. If the school/Chef d'Equipe has not entered the team by the closing date of entries for the Balmoral Show; the 14 April, it will automatically be assumed that the school does not wish to take up the qualifying place, and the next eligible school in line from the applicable qualifier will be contacted on or before the 17 April.
 - e. Should a qualified school fail to participate at the Championships without acceptable evidence for their non-appearance, this school will not be eligible to compete for a qualifying place in 2027.
 - f. The Championship and qualifiers at all participating venues will run under SJI rules as a Competition in Two Phases - Article 274.5.3 Table A. Maximum height of fences will be 1m

ENTRY FEE

£200 per team. Once a school has qualified, entries (non-refundable) declaring the final team athlete/animal combinations in their intended running order must be completed online via the Balmoral Show website at www.balmoralshow.co.uk/competitions/show-jumping/schools-team-show-jumping.

The name and contact details of the team Chef d'Equipe must be identified with the entry.

Please note that the Balmoral Show closing date of **14 April 2026** for show jumping entries will be strictly adhered to, and late entries will not be accepted.

PARKING

Parking for School Team competitors in the **Blue** vehicle park is NOT included in the entry fee and should be booked for the day of the competition. Space is limited therefore it is recommended to purchase online via your E-Net account when making entries.

Cost for Car & Trailer/Duo Horsebox parking will be £35 per vehicle. Lorries will be charged at £40.

If overnight stabling has been purchased, parking passes will allow access to the vehicle park from 6pm the evening before.

Additional parking for cars can be purchased for the Brown vehicle park costing £25 per car per day.

STABLING

Overnight stables are strictly limited and must be booked and paid for in advance along with entry fees. They will be charged at £35 per night. Some shavings will be supplied for bedding.

Bluefrog are the sole suppliers of stable bedding for Balmoral Show. Additional shavings if required will be available for sale onsite.

Stable bookings (for the day of the competition) must be made online via your E-Net account before 17 April 2026.

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WRISTBANDS

10 wristbands per qualified team will be issued for the applicable day and will need to be collected on arrival to permit access to the showgrounds. Additional wristbands costing £16 each (up to a maximum of 5) can be purchased online via your E-Net account. Wristbands purchased during show days will cost £20.

SUBSTITUTIONS

No substitutions from the team entries are allowed, except in the case of a proven injury where the substitution of an athlete/animal from the team entry list may be allowed **up to 4.00pm on Thursday 14 May 2026**. After this date/time, no substitution will be considered. In this regard, the Organising Committee/Showjumping Sub-Committee's decision is final.

ORDER OF STARTING

The order of Teams starting at the Championship will be drawn by the Organising Committee following close of entries. Schools are required to make their team entries in the order they wish their athletes to compete. Start lists for the Championship will be available online via the Balmoral Show website.

ARRIVALS

Teams may arrive on Friday night (providing a stable has been pre purchased) **from 6pm – 9pm** or on Saturday morning **from 6am – 8am** only.

Arrival outside these times will result in refusal of entry. It is not necessary for all team members to arrive together.

All animals will be subject to inspection by the RUAS veterinary team. On arrival animals will need to be unloaded and report to the Equine Office/Vetting Area to facilitate checks. Passports with up-to-date vaccinations must be available for inspection. Please allow sufficient time for this to take place. Any animal without a passport or up-to-date vaccinations will be refused entry.

DECLARATIONS

The Chef d'Equipe should identify themselves at the Show Jumping Office beside the warmup arena **between 8.15am and 8.30am** on the morning of the event to declare all team athletes/animals.

A **compulsory** health & safety briefing will immediately follow and must be attended by all Chef d'Equipes. The Chef d'Equipe is the only person eligible to liaise with the Starter/Ground Jury regarding any difficulties during the competition, e.g. an animal losing a shoe etc.

Any rider or school representative showing unsporting behaviour will automatically be disqualified from their team, and/or have their team disqualified.

PRIZE GIVING

At all qualifying competitions in Ulster Region, the team qualifying on the day will receive qualified rosettes. All 5 ROI teams will receive qualified rosettes when the Chef d'Equipe presents to the Show Jumping Office on the day of the competition.

At the Championship 1st – 3rd teams will be awarded prizes in kind. The Bluegrass Horse Feed Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the winning school. The winning school will be invited by the sponsor to visit their premises to have an educational guided tour.

Rosettes will be awarded to all competing teams. The top 3 teams will be invited to the main arena for the prize giving ceremony. The Chef d'Equipe of the remaining teams will receive their rosettes from the Show Jumping Office.

A Team Turnout prize will be awarded at the Championship to the most appropriately turned out team as chosen by the sponsor. This team will be invited into the main arena to receive their rosettes if they are not already in the top 3 teams.

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REGULATIONS AND GENERAL INFORMATION

1. **COMPETITIONS** - All competitions will be governed by the current National Federation and Show Jumping Ireland rules and regulations.
2. **REGISTRATION** - Animals entered in National competitions must be registered with, and athletes must be members of Showjumping Ireland (SJI) for the current season prior to the qualifying competition.
3. **INTERNATIONAL SELECTION** - Horses selected for any of the International competitions will not be eligible to compete in any of the National competitions at the Show.
4. **HEALTH DECLARATIONS & VACCINATIONS** - All equine animals wishing to compete at Balmoral Show must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza. Passports with certification confirming proper vaccination must be available for inspection on arrival and at any time during the Balmoral Show. No equine will be admitted to the showgrounds unless they have the following:
 - A minimum of the Primary course consisting of 2 vaccinations, not less than 21 days and not more than 92 days apart (not within 7 days of the show).
 - A booster must then be given 150 – 215 days after the 2nd primary vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).
 - An annual booster must be given within 12 months of the previous vaccination (not within 7 days of the show).

All vaccinations should be properly documented in the animal's passport and signed by a veterinary surgeon and stamped with their official practice stamp to authenticate each vaccination.

It is the owner's responsibility to ensure the above has been administered and all dates are correct.

Failure to do so will result in the animal not being admitted to the showgrounds.

Animals entered in National classes may be subject to sampling for illegal substances by HSI.

5. **NUMBERS** - Bridle numbers will be provided and to be collected on arrival from the Equine Office. They must be worn on the bridle at all times or where relevant the head collar when the animal is out of the stable. If these numbers are not clearly displayed, you will not be allowed to enter the arenas.
6. **HIND BOOTS** - Horses competing in the National young horse classes will not be permitted to wear hind boots or bandages. These rules will also extend to the championships at the Balmoral Show. Each athlete/owner wishing to avail of the use of hind boots on their animal must ensure that the boots are those permitted under Article 257N Saddlery of the SJI rules. SJI stewards may attend each qualifier to carry out spot checks.
7. **WELFARE** - All forms of cruel, inhumane or abusive treatment of horses, including, but not limited to, the various forms of rapping, are strictly forbidden in all exercise, schooling and competitions areas as well as elsewhere within the showgrounds.

Any animal not sufficiently under control will not be allowed to compete.
8. **SCHOOLING** - Animals may not be schooled at the competition venue by anyone other than the athlete competing on the animal taking part in the competition.

Animals will be allowed to exercise in the warmup areas providing they have their bridle number visible. Exercising in the main arena or judging rings is strictly prohibited.

All arenas and the lunging pen will be closed between 10.30pm & 5am (Tuesday – Saturday).

The exercising or examination of horses on the paths or roadways is strictly forbidden.
9. **FALLS** - In case of a fall of an athlete and/or a animal at any time in the competition arena, in the warmup arena, or elsewhere within the grounds of the event, the athlete must be checked by the event's medical service (or by a medical doctor if the medical service is not available) before they may be permitted to mount a animal again or take part in the round in progress or in the next round or competition at the event. The animal must be cleared by the Veterinary Delegate before it may be permitted to take part in the next round or competition at the event JRs Art 248.2.1.



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10. **DRESS** - Athletes are required to dress in accordance with this JRs Art 207.2 and GRs Art 135 when inspecting the course, competing, and during prize-giving ceremonies.
It is mandatory for all persons to wear properly fastened protective headgear at all times when mounted on a horse JRs Art 207.1.
11. **INSPECTION OF COURSE** - The arena will be declared open following inspection by the Ground Jury and Course Designer. The course will be open for inspection 15 minutes before the start of the competition and will be walked on foot.
When inspecting the course, correct dress must be worn. All coaches/support personnel/grooms should be tidily dressed when walking the course.
Stewards may refuse admission to the arena if not correctly dressed when entering the arena to walk the course.
12. **ENTRY TO ARENAS** - The arena, warmup arena and assembly pocket are restricted areas. Only those competitors and support personnel who are wearing the correct wristband for the day of the competition shall be permitted access. The assembly pocket will be restricted to mounted competitors only. Viewing of the main arena for unmounted riders/support personnel will be accessible from the rider's viewing marquee.
Should any animal be absent from the position allotted by the stewards in the assembly pocket or should the athlete fail to be in attendance or ready to take his/her allotted part in each round, the animal may be excluded from the competition.
13. **CONDUCT** - The RUAS and Showjumping Ireland reserve the right to refuse entry to any person who engages in conduct which brings the sport into disrepute, demonstrates aggressive or disrespectful behaviour towards staff, officials, volunteers, or other competitors.
14. **DOGS** - No dogs other than assistance dogs are permitted anywhere on the showgrounds including car parks.
15. **INSURANCE** - Equestrian sports involve inherent dangerous risks. To the greatest extent permitted by law, the FEI and the event organiser shall NOT be liable for any damages relating to loss of property or injury of any kind to Athletes, Owners, Support Personnel or horses at or in connection with a FEI Event and the FEI expressly excludes all such liability.

Personal Accident, Health Insurance & Personal Property

It is your responsibility as an Athlete/Owner/Support Personnel to ensure that you have adequate personal accident insurance in place to cover your participation at the Balmoral Show and in particular to insure against any personal injury or medical expenses arising from an accident, injury or illness which may occur at the Event. You should ensure that you are insured against property loss, theft or damage which may occur at the Event.

Third Party Liability Insurance

As an athlete/owner you are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses. You are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party liability insurance providing full coverage in relation to events at home and abroad and to keep your policy up to date. The FEI and the Organiser will NOT be responsible for any damage caused to third parties by you, your employees, support personnel, your agents or your horses.



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ADDITIONAL AWARDS - National & International

Winning Owner Award

A suitable memento will be awarded to the owner of the winning horse in each National and International competition.

Leading International Athlete Award

Non-cash awards will be presented by Equestrian & Farm Feeds, Lisburn to the athlete who has gained most points in all International competitions.

Points will be awarded for each competition as follows: - 1st 8; 2nd 6; 3rd 5; 4th 3; 5th 2; 6th 1.

Where prizes are divided, each athlete dividing will gain the points appropriate to the major prize. In the event of equality for first place, the placing in SJ9 will decide. In the event of further equality, the greatest number of first prizes or second prizes etc. will decide.



Leading International Speed Athlete Award
